A series of instrumental solos, each titled by the composer, with me as an accompanying orchestra member of words.



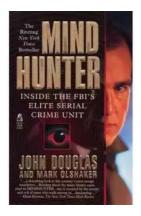
