- I speak to you all men who ever loved someone who didn't love them back.



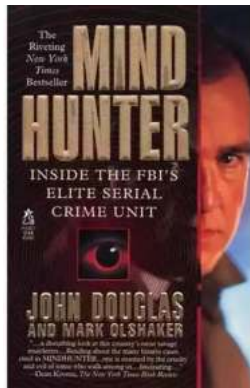

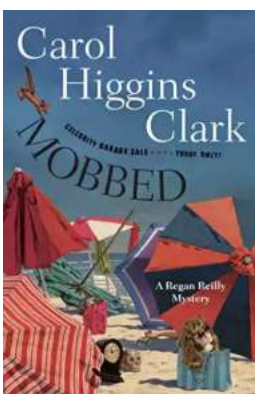
