

I read, much of the night, and go south in the winter.



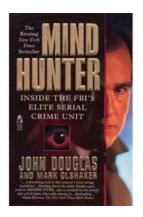

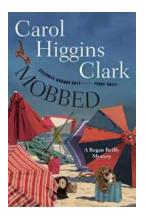
